The elementary school science curriculum specifies that students should learn through hands-on discovery, in order to stimulate curiosity and help them develop a sense of responsibility and respect for living things and the environment. These field trips offer an opportunity for them to develop these skills through a guided tour that engages all the senses and an interactive application activity, as well as unstructured learning time to explore and apply what they have learned.
